COMPLAINT

The State of Arkansas, *ex rel*. Leslie Rutledge, Attorney General ("the State"), for its Complaint against U.S. Business Services, LLC, states:

I. <u>INTRODUCTION</u>

- 1. This is a consumer-protection action brought to redress and restrain violations of the Arkansas Deceptive Trade Practices Act.¹
- 2. Defendants have solicited Arkansas businesses by offering misleading, deceptive, and unneeded services including offers to prepare certain corporate records for a fee of \$150. The solicitations appear to originate from and contain elements implying that they are connected with a governmental entity.

3. The State seeks an injunction, an order of restitution, and the imposition of civil penalties against Defendant for violations of the Arkansas Deceptive Trade Practices Act.

II. PARTIES

- 4. Plaintiff in this action is the State of Arkansas, ex rel. Leslie Rutledge, Attorney General of Arkansas. Attorney General Rutledge is the chief legal officer of the State of Arkansas. The State may seek civil enforcement of the Arkansas Deceptive Trade Practices Act ("ADTPA").²
- 5. Defendant U.S. Business Services, LLC ("USBS") is a Florida limited liability company with a principal place of business currently listed as St. Petersburg, Florida. Its registered agent for service of process is Ronald L. Graham & Company, P.A., 4713 Cattail Lagoon Way, Ponte Vedra Beach, Florida 32802.

III. <u>JURISDICTION</u>

- 6. This Court has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to Ark. Code Ann. § 4-88-104 and the common law of the State of Arkansas.
- 7. Venue is proper pursuant to Ark. Code Ann. § 4-88-104, Ark. Code Ann. § 4-88-112, Ark. Code Ann. § 16-60-104, and the common law of the State of Arkansas.

8. Defendant is a company which has transacted business in the State of Arkansas. The Court also has jurisdiction over the claims and the Defendant in this action pursuant to Ark. Code Ann. § 16-4-101, which extends personal jurisdiction to all persons, causes of action, and claims for relief, to the maximum extent permitted by the Due Process of Law Clause of the Fourteenth Amendment of the United States Constitution. The Defendants have availed themselves of the benefits of conducting business in the State of Arkansas by advertising services, collecting fees from Arkansas consumers for those services.

IV. <u>FACTUAL ALLEGATIONS</u>

- 9. USBS solicits business in Arkansas via direct mailings to Arkansas businesses.³
 - 10. The solicitation offers to

...prepare & provide, for a fee, corporate consent records in lieu of meeting minutes that fulfill the following requirements of Arkansas Law:

- (b) Annual shareholders' meetings may be held in or out of this state at the place stated in or fixed in accordance with the bylaws. If no place is stated in or fixed in accordance with the bylaws, annual meetings shall be held at the corporation's principal office.⁴
- 11. For this service, USBS charges \$150.00. Consumers can pay by check, money order, or credit.

12. The individual elements of the solicitation, when taken together, are specifically designed to give the average consumer the impression that this document should be taken seriously, is official in nature, and required by a government entity. It is formatted and arranged in a manner similar to a governmental tax notice or other similar governmental notification.

13. The solicitation includes a seal in the top left-hand corner which suggests an affiliation with the authority of a government entity.⁵



- 14. It also includes several elements which lend authenticity and convey its "official" nature⁶, including:
 - a. A title which states, "2017 Annual Minutes Statement;"

b. A subtitle which states, "Compliance Division;"

c. A "Key Code," a six-character alphanumeric identifier;

d. A "Notice Date" presumably indicating when the document was mailed;

e. An "Entity #," a nine-digit numeric identifier;

f. An "Incorporation Date" reflecting the date that the entity incorporated in Arkansas;

g. A bar code;



15. The envelope⁷ in which the solicitation arrives, likewise, contains several misleading elements:


a. A prominent statement that the piece of mail is "Important -- Open Immediately;"

IMPORTANT -- OPEN IMMEDIATELY

 A statement that the mailing is "Time Sensitive" and related to the recipient's business;

BUSINESS MAIL - TIME SENSITIVE

c. A return address including both the aforementioned seal and a Little Rock, Arkansas address; and



d. A prominent year notated in the bottom right-hand corner that is disturbingly similar to how a year is depicted on tax forms.⁸

- 16. The subtitle, shown at the top directly above the address, coupled with the notice date and the due date imply that a consumer must undertake a compulsory activity mandated by a division of an official organization. Further, this communicates to a consumer that they will be noncompliant if they do not heed the document's instructions.
- 17. The identifiers, the "Key Code" and "Entity #," both imply that the targeted consumer is in a database and has been assigned an official identification code which is used for multiple purposes. In fact, these serve no purpose but to give the impression that the consumer has an official identification code.
- 18. In actuality, the bar code does not function; it cannot be scanned. It is a graphic element added to the solicitation for the sole purpose of implying to consumers that the consumer has been individually identified.
- 19. The "FOR INTERNAL USE ONLY" and form number are items included in most official paperwork and further imply legitimacy to consumers.

- 20. The Arkansas Code references included in the solicitation by USBS do not convey an accurate representation of the requirements of Arkansas law to the consumers who receive them. The references fail to properly disclose the context of those provisions and any exceptions that would be applicable to those provisions. The code is selectively quoted to convey only those portions which would serve to legitimize the solicitation.
- 21. Importantly, they do not discuss how such requirements affect the many small businesses owned by a single shareholder.
- 22. While quoting Ark. Code Ann. § 4-27-701, which requires a corporation to hold an annual meeting, USBS selectively quotes the statute and conveniently leaves out the subsection which states that, "...failure to hold an annual meeting at the time stated in or fixed in accordance with a corporation's bylaws does not affect the validity of any corporate action."9
- 23. Further, the Arkansas Secretary of State does not require the filing of minutes of any corporate meetings. The only annual filing required by the Secretary of State for businesses incorporated under the Business Corporation Act of 1987¹⁰ is the Annual Franchise Tax Report.¹¹

- 24. In order to conceal its true location in the State of Florida and to further imply their connection with the State of Arkansas, USBS secures a mail drop box at a commercial mail delivery location in our capital city of Little Rock. The commercial mail delivery location then forwards any mail received at that address to USBS's actual location.
- 25. In the middle of the document after the recitation of Arkansas Code provisions, USBS includes the following disclosure: "U.S. Business Services is not a government agency and does not have or contract with any government agency to provide this service nor does it fulfill the State of Arkansas's Annual Report filing requirement."

Corporate minutes may also be prepared by corporate officers or other agents. U.S. Business Services is not a government agency and does not have or contract with any government agency to provide this service nor does it fulfill the State of Arkansas's Annual Report filing requirement.

This disclosure is insufficient to overcome the overall impression the document conveys to an average consumer. It is not prominently or separately displayed. It is not distinguished from the other typewritten information by its font, the size of the font, the color of the font, or placement inside a graphic element, such as a box, which would draw attention to it. Rather, it is intentionally buried in the middle of a block of text that is single-spaced in a small font.

26. The Attorney General has received 32 complaints about the business practices of USBS. Many others have contacted the office by phone in order to report the scam. Of the 27 consumers who have filed complaints, at least three of them paid \$150.00 to USBS as the form instructed. After speaking with the Secretary of State's Office, the Attorney General has learned that it has also

received numerous reports, inquiries, and complaints regarding Defendants' business practices.

- 27. When the Attorney General became aware of the business practices of USBS, 12 it communicated with USBS by letter warning of the Office's concerns. 13 USBS only addressed one of the concerns listed in the Attorney General's correspondence by changing its web address from www.usbusinessservices.org to www.usbusinessservices.biz. The only other material changes made to the solicitation were: (1) a new drop box location to receive mail, and (2) the removal of an email address.
- 28. To further illustrate the misleading nature of the solicitations, when comparing the 2016 solicitations with the 2017 solicitations, it should be noted that the fields for "Key Code" and "Entity #" are interchangeable. In the 2017 version the "Key Code" is a six- to seven-character alphanumeric identifier, but in the 2016 version, it is the "Entity #" which is an alphanumeric identifier. Likewise for the nine-digit numeric identifier, it is the "Entity #" in the 2017 version and the "Key Code" in the 2016 version.

V. VIOLATIONS OF LAW

- 29. The Arkansas Deceptive Trade Practices Act ("DTPA") sets forth the State's statutory program prohibiting deceptive and unconscionable trade practices.¹⁴
- 30. The business practices of Defendants constitute the sale of "goods" or "services." The same business practices constitute business, commerce, or trade. 16
- 31. It is unlawful to "knowingly make a false representation as to the characteristics, ingredients, uses, benefits, alterations, source, approval, or certification of goods or services...." Defendants have engaged in prohibited conduct by misrepresenting:
 - a. Sending solicitations which contain misleading elements such as:
 - i. A seal which implies a governmental entity;
 - ii. A "Key Code," "Entity #," and bar code implying that the organization has been assigned multi-purpose identification codes;

- iii. A "Notice Date" and "Please Respond By" date which implies that there is some externally-imposed due date by which a consumer must comply with the document's instructions, which is untrue;
- iv. A bar code which does not scan and serves no function but to suggest that a consumer has been individually-identified;
- v. Terminology such as "FOR INTERNAL USE ONLY" and a form number which suggests that the document is of an official nature:
- b. Placing a Little Rock, Arkansas address on the solicitation to suggest a connection with the capital city and in order to conceal its location in Florida; and
- c. Using the Arkansas Code to suggest that the consumer engage in some type of mandatory paperwork filing and mandatory fee, which is not in fact mandatory.
- The law prohibits the use of "concealment, suppression, or omission of 32. any material fact with the intent that others rely upon the concealment, suppression, or omission" while selling any goods or services. 18 Defendants have engaged in prohibited conduct by:

- a. Suppressing the disclosure by burying it in the middle of a block of single-spaced text in a small font and failing to display it prominently and separately with typographical elements to distinguish it from the remainder of the document; and
- Placing a Little Rock, Arkansas address on the solicitation in order to conceal its location in Florida; and
- c. Omitting that meeting minutes are not required to be filed with the Secretary of State's Office.
- 33. It is a violation to engage in unconscionable, false, or deceptive acts or practices in business, commerce, or trade. 19 Defendants have engaged in prohibited conduct by:
 - a. Communicating with Arkansas small business consumers and conveying an implied obligation to fill out business-related paperwork while having no authority for such action;
 - b. Collecting a fee of \$150.00 for processing unneeded paperwork;
 - c. Failing to prominently and separately provide a disclosure that USBS is not a government entity; and
 - d. Failing to prominently and separately provide a disclosure that meeting minutes are not required to be filed with the Secretary of State's Office.

VI. PRAYER FOR RELIEF

34. The Attorney General may bring a civil action to seek to prevent persons from engaging in the use or employment of prohibited practices.²⁰

35. Likewise, the Attorney General may bring a civil action to seek to restore to any purchaser who has suffered any ascertainable loss by reason of the use or employment of the prohibited practices any moneys or real or personal property which may have been acquired by means of any practices declared to be unlawful, together with other damages sustained.²¹

36. The Attorney General may seek an injunction prohibiting any person from engaging in any deceptive or unlawful practice.²²

37. Any person who violates the provisions of the DTPA may be assessed a civil penalty of up to \$10,000 per violation.²³

38. In addition, any person who violates the provisions of the Arkansas Deceptive Trade Practices Act shall be liable to the Office of the Attorney General for all costs and fees, including but not limited to, expert witness fees and attorney's fees, incurred by the Office of the Attorney General in the prosecution of such actions.²⁴

- 39. A "person" is an individual, organization, group, association, partnership, corporation, or any combination thereof.²⁵
- 40. Defendant is a "person" who has engaged in an unconscionable, false, or deceptive act or practice in business, commerce, or trade.
 - 41. The State will exercise its right to a trial by jury.

WHEREFORE, the above premises considered, the State of Arkansas *ex rel*.

Leslie Rutledge, Attorney General, respectfully requests that this Honorable Court:

- (A) Issue such orders, pursuant Ark. Code Ann. §§ 4-88-104 and 4-88-113(a)(1), as may be necessary to prevent the use or employment by the Defendant of the practices described herein which are violations of the Arkansas Deceptive Trade Practices Act;
- (B) Issue an order, pursuant to Ark. Code Ann. § 4-88-113(a)(2)(A), requiring Defendants to pay consumer restitution to those Arkansas consumers affected by the activities outlined herein; in addition, or in the alternative, enter an order requiring Defendants to remit to affected consumers all sums obtained from Arkansas consumers by methods prohibited by Arkansas law;
- (C) Issue an order requiring Defendants to comply with requests from those consumers who wish to cancel their service, to discontinue any further efforts to collect money from those consumers, withdraw any consumer accounts that have

been referred to a collection agency, and remove any negative credit information from the consumers' credit record.

- (D) Impose civil penalties pursuant to Ark. Code Ann. § 4-88-113(b), to be paid to the State by the Defendants in the amount of \$10,000.00 per each violation of the Arkansas Deceptive Trade Practices Act proved at a trial of this matter, the full amount of which will exceed the amount necessary to establish federal diversity jurisdiction.
- (E) Issue an order, pursuant to Ark. Code Ann. § 4-88-113(e), requiring Defendants to pay the State's costs in this investigation and litigation, including, but not limited to, attorneys' fees and costs; and
 - (F) For all other just and proper relief to which the State may be entitled.
