ORDER DISMISSING CASE AND GRANTING REQUEST FOR ENTRY OF FINAL JUDGMENT

Re: Dkt. No. 40

On June 13, 2016, Plaintiff filed the Complaint in this action. On November 2, 2016, Defendants Kuwait Finance House and Kuveyt-Turk Participation Bank ("Defendants") moved to dismiss the Complaint. The Court granted that motion on January 24, 2017, and it set February 28, 2017 as the deadline to file an amended complaint. (Dkt. No. 35.)

On February 13, 2017, Plaintiff filed an administrative motion to extend that deadline by 45 days. Plaintiff stated the extension was required because the "individuals whose name and story [sic] will be added" are afraid of retribution and the extension will allow them to consult with families and to assess "the risks involved ... and continuing with the litigation." (Dkt. No. 36, Mot. at 2:9-14.) The Court granted Plaintiff's request for an extension, in part, and it gave Plaintiff until March 24, 2017 to file an amended complaint. (Dkt. No. 39.)

Plaintiff did not comply with that deadline, and on March 28, 2017, Defendants filed a request for entry of final judgment. (Dkt. No. 40.) On March 31, 2017, the Court issued an Order to Show Cause to Plaintiff to show cause why the Court should not enter judgment in favor of all Defendants for lack of standing and for failure to comply with the deadline to file an amended complaint.

Plaintiff's response to that Order to Show Cause was due by April 14, 2017. The Court

also advised Plaintiff that if it failed to file a response by that date, the Court would dismiss this case with prejudice for the reasons set forth in its Order granting Defendants' motion to dismiss. Plaintiff has not filed a response to the Court's Order to Show Cause. Accordingly, for the reasons set forth in the Order granting Defendants' motion to dismiss, and because Plaintiff has failed to comply with the deadline to file an amended complaint, the Court dismisses this case with prejudice, and shall enter judgment in favor of all Defendants, including Hajjaj Al Ajimi.
