NARRATIVE

On January 20, 2017 at 2023 hours, BBPD units responded to 115 Woolbright Rd # D in reference to a shooting.

Upon our arrival, the scene was secured by responding officers and a black Beretta 92FS (serial # H45835Z) was secured at the scene. Contact was made with the occupants of the business Joe Sanchez (DOB 06/07/1986) who was shot in the foot and b/m Anthony Mays (DOB 07/11/1986) who was shot in the hand. May's stated he was the owner of the firearm. Both subjects were quickly interviewed and it was tentatively determined the shooting was accidental. BBFD arrived and began treating the subjects for non life threatening injuries.

At this time other officers arrived on scene and I was directed to obtain the other persons information who were present at the time of the shooting. The females were identified as Vanessa Correa (DOB 12/04/1988) and Tiffany R. Mays (DOB 05/05/1992) who were both uninjured and stated the incident was an accident..

Shortly after, BBPD crime scene and Detective Bureau arrived and took over the investigation. Sanchez and Mays were transported by BBFD to Bethesda Memorial Hospital for further medical treatment.

NARRATIVE

On 01/20/2017 at approximately 2030 hours I responded to 115 W Woolbright Rd #D, The Professional Tax Man in reference this case. Upon arrival I made contact with Sgt Turco #768 who updated me on events. At the time of my arrival Joe (injured), Anthony (injured) and Vanessa (witness) were leaving for BMH and I introduced myself advising we would talk further at BMH. On scene BBPD officers had cleared the business finding no other persons inside and the apparent involved black in color Beretta 9mm was found on the desk just north of the entrance door. BBPD CSI responded to the scene and Tiffany (witness) who was still on scene, filled out and signed a BBPD consent to search for her business. BBPD then processed the scene and recovered the Beretta. Tiffany also provided a sworn written statements to officers. I then responded to BMH where Joe, Anthony and Vanessa provided sworn audio statements in reference events. I provided all parties case cards for future reference.

Joe, Anthony, Tiffany and Vanessa all advised in their statements that Anthony was preparing Joe and his Vanessa's taxes inside of the business when Anthony facing east bound, sitting at a desk observed two large shadows outside of the adjacent window. In response to seeing the shadows Anthony reached for his 9mm Beretta which he kept in a holster under the desk. Anthony had difficulty obtaining the Beretta from the holster subsequently using his left hand to hold the holster down. When Anthony was finally able to pull the gun out of the holster the trigger was accidentally compressed shooting his right hand pointer finger following which the round traveled through the desk towards his clients (Joe and Vanessa), who were sitting on the other side of the desk, striking Joe in the right foot. (Refer to audio/video/ written interviews for specifics.

BMH staff advised that none of the injuries were life threatening though as of this writing Anthony was in surgery with the possibility of permanently losing his finger. Evidence at the scene to include found bullet round, apparent trajectory and location of blood reflected the statements given.

Copies of the audio interviews were turned over to BBPD evidence. The written statement and consent to search affidavit were turned over to BBPD records and are attached to this report. Case closed with injuries accidental.

NARRATIVE

On 1/20/17 at approximately 2041 hours, I responded to Tax Man (The Professionals), located at 115 W Woolbright Rd, Suite D, Boynton Beach, in reference to a shooting investigation causing alleged accidental injury to two individuals.

Det. Joseph advised that Anthony Mays, DOB 7/11/65, was sitting at his office desk preparing taxes for a customer, Joe Sanchez, DOB 6/7/87, when Mays saw two large shadows walk by the front office window. Mays attempted to retrieve his firearm from its holster, when the firearm accidentally discharged, shooting Mays in the hand and Sanchez, who was on the opposite side of the desk, in the foot. Sanchez was transported to the Bethesda East Hospital prior to my arrival on scene.

The front door to the business faces S. Upon examining the scene, I observed blood drops on the sidewalk in front of the business, and three chairs near the front door, with blood on the sidewalk and grass surrounding the chairs. A bloody paper towel was located on the chair that was currently propping the door open. The inside of the business consisted of two desks, one located on the W side of the office which faces E, and one on the E side which faces S. A door on the N wall of the office opened into a hallway leading to the office bathroom.

I observed a rolled up black sock and a black Jordan flip flop on the floor just inside the front door. There were multiple areas of blood on the carpet and on the walls near the W desk. On the E desk, I observed a black handgun. I was advised by Sgt. Turco that this was the gun that was discharged during the incident, and that it was currently loaded with the hammer cocked. I observed what appeared to be the entrance of a bullet hole located underneath the W desk. The exit of the hole was located on the opposite side of the desk, and a graze mark was in the carpet immediately next to a chair. I observed tiny projectile fragments inside the graze mark. Underneath the desk to the far right, was a black gun holster. There were blood drops leading into the bathroom and on the bathroom counter, and the water in the bathroom sink was running.

Using a Nikon D7100 digital camera, I photographed the scene.

Sgt. Turco was able to make the gun safe. Upon doing so, one spent shell casing was located inside the chamber.

I took the following approximate measurements at the scene:

Floor to bullet hole entrance underneath desk: 9 inches
Floor to bullet hole exit on opposite side of desk: 9 inches

I collected the following items from the scene:

1. 9mm Beretta Parabellum, model# 92FS, S/N: H45835Z, w/ magazine w/ 4 live rounds: Blazer 9mm Luger (from E desk)
2. (1) Spent shell casing from chamber of Beretta: Blazer 9mm Luger
3. Black holster (from under W desk)
4. Black sock w/ blood (from office floor)
5. Right black Jordan flip flop w/ blood (from office floor)
6. Projectile fragments (from office carpet)

Using individual sterile swabs and swab boxes, I collected the following swabs from the scene:

1. Blood on office carpet
2. Blood on NW office wall

I secured all items in my Crime Scene vehicle and, at approximately 2148 hours, I responded to the Bethesda East Hospital, in reference to documenting both victims injuries.

While taking additional photos of the collected items, I observed bullet holes in both the black sock and black Jordan flip flop. I located and collected the projectile from inside the black sock belonging to Sanchez.

An NCIC/FCIC check of the 9mm Beretta revealed no record found.

On 1/21/17, I collected the following swabs from the grips, trigger, sights, and slide of the Beretta, and performed a test fire of the Beretta, with it functioning

as expected. The spent shell casing from the test fire was turned over to CSI McKinlay for BrassTrax entry.

All swabs were packaged and sealed and submitted into Evidence, and all photos were submitted into Evidence.
