Plaintiff, Veronica Pagan ("Plaintiff"), through her attorneys, Castronovo & McKinney, LLC, files this Complaint and Jury Demand seeking compensatory damages, punitive damages, attorneys' fees, and costs of suit from Defendants, Food Fair La Gran Marqueta d/b/a Food Fair ("Food Fair") and Essex County Sheriff's Office ("Defendants") and alleges as follows:

FACTS

A. Jurisdiction and Venue

- 1. Plaintiff resides at 95 W. 54th Street, Bayonne, New Jersey.
- 2. Defendant Food Fair is located at 946 Market Street, Paterson NJ and conducts business in Passaic County, New Jersey.
- 3. Defendant Essex County Sheriff's Office, 50 W. Market Street, Newark, NJ is a governmental entity conducting operations in Essex County, New Jersey.
- 4. Defendant John Doe, the Essex County Sheriff's officer who was working at Food Fair the evening of May 12, 2017, resides at unknown address.

B. Plaintiff's Gender Identity

- 5. Plaintiff is a female.
- 6. Plaintiff identifies as a transgender woman who wears a prosthetic penis.

C. Plaintiff's Privacy Is Violated by Food Fair

- 7. On May 12, 2017, at approximately 10pm, Plaintiff went to Food Fair.
- 8. While in the store, a Food Fair Security Guard, who was an off-duty Essex County Sheriff's Officer, stopped Ms. Pagan.
 - 9. The officer insisted, three times, "I need to see what is in your pants."
- 10. In response to the officer's demands, Plaintiff stated she is a female who identifies as a transgender woman and wears a prosthetic penis.
- 11. The officer then stated to Plaintiff and the manager of Food Fair that he needed to call a female police officer to inspect Plaintiff.
 - 12. At this point, Plaintiff became very scared and attempted to leave Food Fair.
- 13. The officer denied Plaintiff the ability to leave the facility insisting he needed to inspect Plaintiff's pants.
 - 14. The officer specifically stated he needed to inspect the inside of Plaintiff's pants.
- 15. Plaintiff then began begging for help and felt scared, humiliated, intimidated and abused.
 - 16. Plaintiff sought help from a cashier to no avail.
 - 17. Plaintiff's additional attempts to leave the store were barred by the officer.
- 18. Shockingly, rather than wait for a female police officer to arrive, a female cashier was called to conduct an invasive inspection of Plaintiff.

- 19. During this inspection, Plaintiff showed the cashier the prosthetic penis and her vagina.
- 20. Throughout the inspection, Plaintiff was crying and continued to feel humiliated and abused.
- 21. Despite her distress, Ms. Pagan was powerless to stop the harassment because this harassment came from or was in the presence of an Essex County police officer and/or Food Fair manager and employees.
 - 22. After revealing herself to the cashier, Plaintiff walked out of the restroom.
- 23. As Plaintiff was walking out of the restroom to leave the store, the officer stated, "I am so sorry."

COUNT I

LAD - Gender Identity Discrimination

- 24. Plaintiff repeats and incorporates the facts alleged in the preceding paragraphs.
- 25. Plaintiff is a female who identifies as a transgender woman who wears a prosthetic penis.
 - 26. Defendants required Plaintiff to submit to an invasive body search.
- 27. Defendants' actions constitute discrimination on the basis of Plaintiff's gender identity that violates the Law Against Discrimination, N.J.S.A. 10:5-1, et seq.
- 28. Defendants' conduct was willful, malicious and/or especially egregious and done with the knowledge and/or participation of upper level management.
- 29. As a result of Defendants' wrongful conduct, Plaintiff has suffered, and continues to suffer, damages including: emotional distress, pain and suffering, physical ailments, and other damages.

COUNT II

Invasion of Privacy

- 30. Plaintiff repeats and incorporates the facts alleged in the preceding paragraphs.
- 31. Plaintiff is a female who identifies as a transgender woman who wears a prosthetic penis.
- 32. By requiring Plaintiff to submit to a search of her person including showing her vagina and prosthetic penis, Defendants improperly intruded upon Plaintiff in way that is highly offensive to a reasonable person.
 - 33. Defendants' actions constitute an invasion of privacy.
- 34. As a result of Defendants' wrongful conduct, Plaintiff has suffered, and continues to suffer, damages including: emotional distress, pain and suffering, physical ailments, and other damages.

COUNT III

False Imprisonment

- 35. Plaintiff repeats and incorporates the facts alleged in the preceding paragraphs.
- 36. Plaintiff was improperly detained at Food Fair.
- 37. Plaintiff attempted to leave Food Fair on more than one occasion and was prevented from doing so by Defendants.
 - 38. Defendants lacked the authority or justification to detain Plaintiff.
 - 39. Defendants' actions constitute false imprisonment.
- 40. As a result of Defendants' wrongful conduct, Plaintiff has suffered, and continues to suffer, damages including: emotional distress, pain and suffering, physical ailments, and other damages.

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COUNT IV

Aiding and Abetting Discrimination - Defendant Police Officer

41. Defendant Police Officer was employed by Defendants.

42. Defendant Police Officer knowingly gave substantial assistance or encouragement

to Defendant Food Fair in its unlawful discrimination against Plaintiff.

43. Defendant Police Officer discriminated against Plaintiff on the basis of her gender

identity that violates the New Jersey Law Against Discrimination, N.J.S.A. 10:5-1, et seq.

44. Defendant Police Officer is liable for aiding and abetting the unlawful

discrimination against Plaintiff in violation of the New Jersey Law Against Discrimination,

N.J.S.A. 10:5-12(e).

45. As a result of Defendant Police Officer's wrongful conduct, Plaintiff has suffered,

and continues to suffer, damages including: emotional distress, pain and suffering, physical

ailments, and other damages.

WHEREFORE, Plaintiff seeks judgment against Defendants awarding her

compensatory damages, punitive damages, attorneys' fees, costs of suit, pre- and post-judgment

interest, and all other relief that the Court deems equitable and just.
