COMPLAINT

THIS CASE HAS BEEN ASSIGNED TO JUDGE M. MULVIHILL DEPARTMENT 10C FOR ALL PURPOSES. INCLUDING TRIAL

I. GENERAL ALLEGATIONS – NEGLIGENCE AS AGAINST ALL DEFENDANTS

- 1. Defendant Gabriel Reithknecht-Lopez is an individual who was an employee of Denny's located at 4747 Pacific Avenue, Stockton, California.
- 2. Plaintiff ANDRES RAMIREZ is an individual, who is of Hispanic descent, and was at all times hereto a resident of the County of San Joaquin.
- 3. Yadav, Inc is a corporation organized pursuant to California law with principle place of business located at 4747 Pacific Ave, Stockton, California, Yadav, Inc. conducts business as a Denny's franchise.

- 4. Denny's, Inc is a corporation with home office in Spartanburg, South Carolina. Denny's, Inc is authorized to do business in California.
- 5. DOES 1 through 10 are fictitiously named defendants whose identity Plaintiff is ignorant of. Plaintiff is informed and believes, and based on such belief, alleges that such Defendants are in some fashion liable for acts and failures to act as hereinafter alleged. Plaintiff prays leave to amend his complaint with appropriate charging allegations upon ascertaining the true identity, capacity, and basis of liability of such fictitiously named defendants.
- 6. At all relevant times all defendants were acting within the scope and agency of every other defendant and all defendants were agents for every other individual defendant were jointly employed by Defendant Yadav, Inc.
- 7. DOES 1 to 2 work together to own, manage, control, and operate a Denny's restaurant located at 4747 Pacific Avenue, Stockton, California as will be shown according to proof. .
- 8. All relevant times, Yadav, Inc, Denny's Inc, and DOES 1 and 2 were responsible for the management, training, selection of employees, supervision of employees, training of employees, and education of employees as will be shown according to proof.
- 9. On December 8, 2016, Plaintiff and three other individuals who were friends of Plaintiff came in to consume food at the Denny's restaurant located at 4747 Pacific Ave, Stockton, California.

- 10. At that point, Gabriel Reithknecht-Lopez was irritated by something that was said or done by one of the Plaintiff's friends and/or by the Plaintiff himself and a verbal dispute commenced. Plaintiff walked to the bathroom.
- 11. When Plaintiff returned from the bathroom Gabriel Reithknecht-Lopez, and one of Plaintiff's friends were in a verbal disagreement.
- 12. Gabriel Reithknecht-Lopez thereupon pulled a knife and stabbed Plaintiff causing the knife to penetrate into Plaintiff's bodily organs which almost resulted in his death.
- 13. As a direct and proximate result of said injury, Plaintiff almost died and has been disabled ever since. The stabbing of Plaintiff was done either maliciously and with intent to injure or negligently as will be shown according to proof.
- 14. Plaintiff is informed and believes that Gabriel Reithknecht-Lopez received inadequate training not suitable for a job of this type by virtue of his demeanor and disposition.
- 15. As a direct and proximate result of the negligent actions of Defendants, and each of them, Plaintiff suffered physical injuries and the following damages:
 - A. Past and future medical care expenses for medical care providers as will be shown according to proof;
 - B. Loss of income and earning potential as will be shown according to proof;
 - Pain and suffering, emotional distress, and loss of enjoyment of life as will be shown according to proof;

- D. Pursuant to Section 52 of the Civil Code, Plaintiff is entitled to actual damages and exemplary damages as will be shown according to proof and, further, is entitled to \$25,000.00 civil penalty as will be shown according to proof.
- 16. Plaintiff has used the services of Michael F. Babitzke, Attorney-at-Law, and will be billed for reasonable attorney's expenses and is seeking compensation for those expenses.

WHEREFORE Plaintiff prays for relief as set forth below.

II. FIRST CAUSE OF ACTION AGAINST ALL DEFENDANTS VIOLATION OF UNRUH CIVIL RIGHTS ACT

- 17. Plaintiff incorporates the general allegations as fully as if set forth herein.
- 18. As a direct and proximate result, Section 51 of the Civil Code, commonly known as the Unruh Civil Rights Act, was violated by all defendants as will be shown according to proof.

WHEREFORE Plaintiff prays for relief as set forth below.

II. SECOND CAUSE OF ACTION VIOLATION OF SECTION 51.7 OF THE CIVIL CODE

- 19. Plaintiff incorporates by reference the general allegations and the entire first cause and the second cause of action as fully as if set forth herein.
- 20. As set forth above, Plaintiff was injured by a violent act of Defendants, while attempting to use a public accommodation.
- 21. Section 51.7 of the Civil Code prohibits violence and provides that every citizen in this state is to be free from violent actions by business persons or those

working on behalf of businesses. Accordingly, defendants violated Civil Code Section 51.7.

WHEREFORE Plaintiff prays for relief as fully as if set forth herein.

III. THIRD CAUSE OF ACTION

NEGLIGENCE AS TO ALL DEFENDANTS

- 22. Plaintiff incorporates the general allegations, first cause of action, and second cause of action as fully as if set forth herein.
- 23. In doing the acts and/or failing to do the acts hereinafter alleged, the Defendants and each of them failed to comply with the standard of care for operating regional restaurant facilities such as Denny's located at 4747 Pacific Ave Stockton, California.
- 24. As a direct and proximate cause, Plaintiff was significantly injured as alleged above and as will be shown according to proof.

WHEREFORE Plaintiff prays for relief as set forth below.

IV. FOURTH CAUSE OF ACTION

INTENTIONAL INFLICTION OF EMOTIONAL DISTRESS

- 25. Plaintiff incorporates by reference all of the allegations set forth above. In doing the as alleged herein defendants acted intentionally and with malice and with intent to injure and harm.
 - 26. As a result of such behavior, Plaintiff is entitled to exemplary damages.

V. FIFTH CAUSE OF ACTION

NEGLIGENT EMPLOYMENT

- 27. Plaintiff incorporated by reference in paragraphs 1 to 26 as set forth above.
- 28. In the recruitment and hiring employees, Yadav, Inc and Denny's, Inc failed to exercise reasonable care in the selection of Gabriel Reithknecht-Lopez as an employee.
- 29. As a direct and proximate result of such negligence, Plaintiff was damaged as set forth above.

VI. SIXTH CAUSE OF ACTION

NEGLIGENT TRAINING

- 30. Plaintiff incorporates paragraphs 1 to 26 as fully as if set forth above.
- 31. Defendants Yadav, Inc and Denny's Inc failed to train Gabriel Reithknecht-Lopez in accordance with proper standards and accordingly fell below the standard care for training.
- 32. As a direct and proximate result, Plaintiff was injured and damaged as set forth above.

WHEREFORE Plaintiff prays for relief as set forth below.

VII. SEVENTH CAUSE OF ACTION

NEGLIGENT SUPERVISION

- 33. Plaintiff incorporates paragraphs 1 to 34 as fully as if set forth above.
- 34. Defendants Yadav, Inc. and Denny's Inc failed to supervise Gabriel Reithknecht-Lopez, the assailant, in a reasonable fashion

35. As a direct result of said negligence, Plaintiff was injured and suffered damages as set forth herein.

WHEREFORE Plaintiff prays for relief as set forth below:

- 1. For past and future medical care expenses;
- For past and future loss of wages, loss of employment, and employment capacity;
- 3. For physical pain and suffering and emotional distress damages;
- 4. For loss of enjoyment of life as will be shown according to proof;
- For three times the amount of reasonable attorney fees permitted
 by law as provided for in Section 52 of the Civil Code;
- For three times the actual damages as set forth in Section 52 of the Civil Code;
- 7. For reasonable attorneys fees;
- 8. For cost of suit;
- 9. For such other and further relief as this court deems proper and just.
