COMPLAINT TO ENFORCE PUBLIC RECORDS ACT

Pursuant to Article I, Section 24 of the Florida Constitution and Chapter 119 of the Florida Statutes, The Associated Press; the First Amendment Foundation; Gannett Co., Inc.; Miami Herald Media Company; The New York Times Company; Orlando Sentinel Communications Co.; Scripps Media, Inc.; Sun-Sentinel Company, LLC; Times Publishing Co.; and WP Company LLC (collectively, the “News Media”) file this Complaint to enforce the Florida Public Records Act against the Agency for Health Care Administration, Secretary Mary C. Mayhew, the Florida Department of Health, Surgeon General Scott A. Rivkees, M.D., the Executive Office of the Governor, and Governor Ron DeSantis.

Since the onset of COVID-19 infections in Florida long term care facilities, the News Media have pushed for access to critical records about the virus' presence there. The virus presents the greatest risk to Florida's most vulnerable, isolated, and, for some, mentally infirm, population: citizens living within our state's long-term care facilities. First, the News Media pursued access to records revealing the names of facilities. On the eve of a lawsuit and weeks after the request was made, the State released for the first time a list naming the facilities with COVID-19 cases. The names alone, however, provided little context for families. The News Media then sought records identifying information on COVID-19 infections at facilities, including infection numbers for residents by facility, infection numbers for staff by facility, resident death numbers by facility, staff death numbers by facility, and testing numbers and results. On the day that the statutory litigation notice period ran, the State released some of what the News Media requested in chart form. Most importantly, however, the State has yet to release perhaps the most critical records requested: the numbers of resident and staff deaths by facility. The need for this information is heightened given Governor DeSantis' emergency orders restricting public access to such facilities, walling off residents from outside contact. The News Media do not seek any information identifying specific residents or staff infected by the virus, but they do seek immediate access to the remaining records requested. The ongoing delay remains unlawful.

As grounds for this Complaint, the News Media state:

JURISDICTION AND VENUE

1. This Court has subject matter jurisdiction pursuant to Article V, Section 5(b) of the Florida Constitution and Section 119.11 of the Florida Statutes.
2. Venue is proper in Leon County because the public records at issue are located there.

3. All conditions precedent to this action have occurred, or have been excused or waived.

PARTIES

4. Plaintiff The Associated Press (“AP”) is an independent, not-for-profit corporation that operates in more than one hundred countries and provides news content, including original AP reporting, to its members. AP uses public records, including the records of the Defendants, as important newsgathering sources.

5. Plaintiff the First Amendment Foundation (“FAF”) is a charitable organization dedicated to open government and public access, headquartered in Tallahassee, Florida.

6. Plaintiff Gannett Co., Inc. (“Gannett”) is the largest local newspaper company in the United States. Its 260 local daily brands in 46 states and Guam—together with USA TODAY—reach an estimated digital audience of 140 million each month. Gannett publications in Florida include: *Daily Commercial*, *Daytona Beach News-Journal*, *Florida Today*, *Herald-Tribune*, *Naples Daily News*, *Northwest Florida Daily News*, *Ocala Star Banner*, *Panama City News Herald*, *Pensacola News Journal*, *Tallahassee Democrat*, *TC Palm*, *The Destin Log*, *The Florida Times-Union*, *The Gainesville Sun*, *The Ledger*, *The News-Press*, *The Palm Beach Post*, *The Star*, *The Walton Sun*, and *Washington County News*. Gannett uses public records, including the records of the Defendants, as important newsgathering sources.

7. Plaintiff Miami Herald Media Company (the “Herald”) publishes *The Miami Herald*, a newspaper of general circulation in Miami-Dade County, Florida. The Herald also maintains a news website at www.miamiherald.com. The Herald uses public records, including records of the Defendants, as important newsgathering sources.

8. Plaintiff Orlando Sentinel Communications Company (the “Sentinel”) publishes the *Orlando Sentinel*, a newspaper of general circulation in Orange County, Florida. The Sentinel also maintains a website at www.orlandosentinel.com. The Sentinel uses public records, including records of the Defendants, as important newsgathering sources.

9. Plaintiff The New York Times Company (the “NYT”) publishes *The New York Times*, a newspaper of general circulation nationwide. The NYT also maintains a news website at www.nytimes.com. The NYT uses public records, including records of the Defendants, as important newsgathering sources.

10. Plaintiff Scripps Media, Inc. (“Scripps”) owns five Florida television stations: WFTS (Tampa Bay), WFTX (Ft. Myers-Naples), WPTV (West Palm Beach), WSFL (Miami-Ft. Lauderdale) and WTXL (Tallahassee) and their associated news websites. Scripps uses public records, including records of the Defendants, as important newsgathering sources.

11. Plaintiff Sun-Sentinel Company, LLC (the “Sun Sentinel”) publishes the *South Florida Sun Sentinel*, a newspaper of general circulation, primarily in Broward County, Florida. The Sun Sentinel also maintains a news website at www.sun-sentinel.com. The Sun Sentinel uses public records, including records of the Defendants, as important newsgathering sources.

12. Plaintiff Times Publishing Co. (“TBT”) publishes the *Tampa Bay Times*, a newspaper of general circulation in the greater Tampa Bay area. TBT also maintains a news website at www.tampabay.com. TBT uses public records, including records of the Defendants, as important newsgathering sources.

13. Plaintiff WP Company LLC (“The Post”) publishes *The Washington Post*, a newspaper of general circulation nationwide. The Post also maintains a news website at

www.washingtonpost.com. The Post uses public records, including records of the Defendants, as important newsgathering sources.

14. Defendant Agency for Health Care Administration (“AHCA”) is a public agency as defined by Section 119.011(2) of the Florida Statutes and an executive branch agency subject to Article I, Section 24 of the Florida Constitution and Chapter 119.

15. Defendant Mary C. Mayhew is the Secretary of AHCA. Secretary Mayhew is the custodian of AHCA’s public records and is sued in her official capacity.

16. Defendant Florida Department of Health (“DOH”) is a public agency as defined by Section 119.011(2) of the Florida Statutes and an executive branch component subject to Article I, Section 24 of the Florida Constitution and Chapter 119.

17. Defendant Dr. Scott A. Rivkees is Surgeon General of Florida and the State Health Officer for DOH. Dr. Rivkees is the custodian of DOH’s public records and is sued in his official capacity.

18. Defendant Executive Office of the Governor (“EOG”) is a public agency as defined by Section 119.011(2) of the Florida Statutes and part of the executive branch subject to Article I, Section 24 of the Florida Constitution and Chapter 119.

19. Defendant Ron DeSantis is the Governor of Florida. Governor DeSantis is the custodian of EOG’s public records and is sued in his official capacity.

FACTUAL BACKGROUND

Pursuing Records Concerning COVID-19 & Florida’s Long-Term Care Facilities

20. Florida’s elderly residents are among those most vulnerable to COVID-19 and at greatest risk for fatalities. Florida’s long-term care facilities include assisted living facilities, nursing homes, long-term care facilities, and other elderly care residential facilities (for ease,

collectively referred to as “Long-Term Care Facilities”). These are group homes where many of Florida’s elderly live in close proximity to one another. Due to the highly contagious nature of COVID-19, a single infection among a Long-Term Care Facility’s staff or residents can spread quickly to disastrous effect. Knowing statistics on the virus when loved ones reside in Long-Term Care Facilities where there are infections allows families and caregivers to make informed decisions regarding whether their loved ones should remain at the facility—and whether, and under what circumstances, they should be moved or brought home.

21. Records revealing information about the Long-Term Care Facilities with active cases of the virus are of obvious public importance. Beginning at least by March 23, 2020, the News Media began making various public records requests to the Defendants related to records identifying facilities where there were COVID-19 cases involving residents or staff. After the News Media pressed for the records and after a public outcry over identifying the facilities, the State began posting a facility list that is periodically updated. The list is available at the last “See the report” button here: <https://floridahealthcovid19.gov/#latest-stats>. The first list was posted on Saturday, April 18, 2020, a copy of which is attached as **Exhibit 1**. More than 300 Long-Term Care Facilities are named. From the beginning, the list was flawed.¹

22. Certain facilities where there are known and publicly reported COVID-19 cases are not on the list. Conversely, the list contains facilities that dispute their inclusion on the list. Moreover, the list contained no information about the virus at any given facility.

23. On Monday, April 20, 2020, a public records request was sent by counsel on behalf of the News Media seeking records detailing:

1. The addresses tied to the names of every Florida nursing home, assisted living facility, rehab facility, intermediate care facility for the developmentally disabled, group home for the developmentally disabled, and mental health facility (including forensic hospitals) in which at least one resident and/or staff member has tested positive for COVID-19;

2. The number of corresponding residents at each facility who have tested positive;

3. The number of corresponding staff members at each facility who have tested positive;

4. The number of corresponding residents at each facility who have died from COVID-19;

5. The number of corresponding staff members at each facility who have died from COVID-19; and

6. The number of COVID-19 tests performed at each facility, and their outcomes (positive, negative or pending) by number involving residents or staff at each facility.

See Exhibit 2. Earlier the same day, the Herald made a similar public records request. See Exhibit

3. For ease of reference, the records requested in **Exhibits 2** and **3** are collectively referred to herein as the “Long-Term Care Facilities COVID-19 Records.”

24. The News Media’s public records requests found at **Exhibits 2** and **3** do not seek any information that would personally identify individuals who have been diagnosed with COVID-19.

25. The public records requests were acknowledged by the Defendants. Despite repeated requests for information on the status of the request, no records were provided or release dates given. Then today, Monday, April 27, 2020, the very day the attorneys' fee litigation notice period expired, the State released a chart with additional information about the virus by facility: <https://floridahealthcovid19.gov/wp-content/uploads/2020/04/lcf-list.pdf>. A copy of this chart is attached as **Exhibit 4**. The chart, however, does not contain all of the information requested -- most importantly, records revealing staff and resident deaths by facility.

26. An enormous amount of time and effort have been invested in obtaining records providing information about COVID-19 infections in specific Long Term Care Facilities. Still, the State has released no records revealing death totals by facility. The public cannot continue to wait for the crucial fatality information contained in the records sought by the News Media.

The Public Emergency & Long-Term Care Facilities

27. The State has taken extraordinary steps related to controlling COVID-19 spread. On March 1, 2020, Governor DeSantis issued Executive Order 20-51. A true and correct copy of that order is attached as **Exhibit 5**. In that order, Governor DeSantis recognized that COVID-19 "is a severe acute respiratory illness that can spread among humans through respiratory transmission" and directed Dr. Rivkees to declare a state of emergency within Florida due to the worldwide COVID-19 outbreak. See id. at pp. 1-2.

28. Eight days later, on March 9, 2020, Governor DeSantis issued Executive Order 20-52. A true and correct copy of that order is attached as **Exhibit 6**. That order again recognized the public health threat posed by COVID-19 "to the entire State of Florida" and the need for social distancing/enhanced personal hygiene habits to help prevent its spread. See id. at pp. 1-2.

Governor DeSantis also noted that he is “responsible for meeting the dangers presented to this state and its people by this emergency.” See id. at p. 2.

29. Recognizing the particular threat COVID-19 poses to Long-Term Care Facilities’ populations, the Division of Emergency Management (“DEM”), at Governor DeSantis’ direction, has issued orders specifically designed to prevent COVID-19 spread within such facilities.

30. On March 11, 2020, DEM issued an order prohibiting Long-Term Care Facility access to persons showing symptoms of respiratory infection, persons who have had recent contact with anyone infected with COVID-19, and those who have recently traveled internationally or on a cruise ship. See DEM Order No. 20-002, Mar. 11, 2020 at p. 2. A true and correct copy of the order is attached as **Exhibit 7**.

31. DEM followed up four days later by issuing an additional order further restricting access to Long-Term Care Facilities. See DEM Order No. 20-006, Mar. 15, 2020. A true and correct copy of the order is attached as **Exhibit 8**. Among other things, this second order prohibited “the entry of any individual” except under certain limited and enumerated circumstances. Notably, the order permits entry only by “family members, friends, and visiting residents in end-of-life situations.” See id. at p. 2.

32. The State is tracking incidents of COVID-19 in Long-Term Care Facilities. Since approximately March 16, 2020, it has produced daily (twice daily until April 24) COVID-19 Data Daily Reports² that provide the total number of COVID-19 cases diagnosed in Long-Term Care Facilities by county. They do not further identify numbers of cases by specific Long-Term Care Facility. Examples of these county-by-county breakdowns for Long-Term Care Facilities taken

from the April 21-24 daily reports are attached as **Composite Exhibit 9**. In the span of just four days, reported cases in such facilities jumped from 2,153 to 2,682. See id.

33. The April 24 report reveals that Miami-Dade County and Broward County together account for approximately 33% of total reported Long-Term Care Facility cases (907 cases). See id. Leon County had seen the tenth largest outbreak of Long-Term Care Facility COVID-19 cases with 72. See id.

34. The April 24 data also shows that counties with smaller populations are not immune from COVID-19 spread. Suwannee County in fact had more cases than Leon County, reporting 92 total cases within Long-Term Care Facilities. See id. Likewise, Clay County also experienced disproportionately high infections rates (124 cases). See id.

35. The daily reports breakdown by county the total number of deaths at Long Term Care Facilities. All told, as of April 24 approximately 28% of all reported COVID-19 deaths (296) occurred at Long-Term Care Facilities. See Exhibit 10 (also noting that as of April 24, 1,046 total COVID-19 deaths occurred in Florida).³ By today, Monday, April 27, 2020, the death toll in Long Term Care Facilities had risen to 319.

36. Governor DeSantis has also been vocal about the relatively large number of COVID-19 deaths experienced at a Broward County Long-Term Care Facility he publicly named, Atria Willow Wood. On March 20, 2020, Governor DeSantis accused the facility of failing to take necessary precautions and putting their residents at risk and demanded Long-Term Care Facility administrators take action to protect their residents.⁴

37. As of April 6, 2020, seven COVID-19 deaths had occurred at Atria Willow Wood and an additional twelve residents were infected.⁵

38. To stem COVID-19's spread in Florida's Long-Term Care Facilities, Governor DeSantis deployed the National Guard to aid in testing.⁶

COUNT I (Unlawful Refusal to Provide Public Records)

39. The News Media incorporate the allegations contained in paragraphs 1 through 38, and all referenced exhibits and embedded links, as if fully set forth herein.

40. The Long-Term Care Facilities COVID-19 Records, specifically including the records related to staff and resident deaths by facility, are public records as encompassed by Article

I, Section 24(a) of the Florida Constitution, defined in Section 119.011(12) of the Florida Statutes, and interpreted by Florida courts.

41. The constitutional right of access to public records applies to “any public body, officer, or employee of the state, or persons acting on their behalf . . .” Art. I, § 24, Fla. Const. AHCA, DOH, and EOG are “public bodies” under Article I, Section 24 of the Florida Constitution.

42. AHCA, DOH, and EOG are also public agencies as defined in Section 119.011(2) of the Florida Statutes. Secretary Mayhew, Dr. Rivkees, and Governor DeSantis are the respective custodians of the public records of AHCA, DOH, and EOG.

43. The Defendants have both a constitutional and statutory legal obligation pursuant to Section 119.07 of the Florida Statutes to provide access to and copies of any non-exempt public records upon request.

44. No public records law exemptions exist that would prevent the inspection or copying of the Long-Term Care Facilities COVID-19 Records, specifically including those records related to COVID-19 deaths in Long Term Care Facilities.

45. The Defendants have failed and refused to provide all of the Long-Term Care Facilities COVID-19 Records.

46. The Defendants’ failure and refusal to provide all of the Long-Term Care Facilities COVID-19 Records violates Chapter 119 of the Florida Statutes, and Article I, Section 24(a) of the Florida Constitution, and is unlawful.

REQUEST FOR IMMEDIATE HEARING

47. Section 119.11(1) of the Florida Statutes provides that courts are to set immediate hearings in actions to enforce the provisions of the Public Records Act and are to give such cases priority over other pending cases. See Salvador v. Fennelly, 593 So. 2d 1091, 1094 (Fla. 4th DCA

1992) (recognizing the importance of the statutory provision for immediate hearings in Public Records Act cases because “time can be an important element in the right of access to public records”).

48. As the Florida Supreme Court has recognized: “News delayed is news denied.” State ex. Rel. Miami Herald Publ’g Co. v. McIntosh, 340 So. 2d 904, 910 (Fla. 1976). The News Media therefore request an immediate hearing (telephonic or otherwise) and that this case be given priority over other pending cases. Accordingly, any delay in producing public records beyond the limited time required to retrieve records and review/redact for exemption is unlawful. See Tribune Co. v. Cannella, 458 So. 2d 1075, 1078-79 (Fla. 1984) (rejecting agency policy of automatic 48-hour delay before releasing public records). In addition to the requirements of Chapter 119, the present public need for the information contained in the requested records justifies an immediate hearing.

REQUEST FOR ATTORNEYS’ FEES

49. Section 119.12 of the Florida Statutes provides that “[i]f a civil action is filed against an agency to enforce the provisions of this chapter and if the court determines that such agency unlawfully refused to permit a public record to be inspected or copied, the court shall assess and award, against the agency responsible, the reasonable costs of enforcement including reasonable attorneys’ fees.”

50. To the extent applicable, the News Media have complied with the written notice provisions set forth in Section 119.12(1)(b) of the Florida Statutes related to the recoupment of attorneys’ fees.

51. The News Media have retained undersigned counsel in this matter and are obligated to pay to counsel attorneys' fees, costs, and expenses in connection with this matter. Counsel is entitled to a reasonable attorneys' fee.

52. The News Media will serve a copy of this lawsuit on the Department of Financial Services per Section 284.30, Florida Statutes.

RELIEF REQUESTED

WHEREFORE, the News Media request that this Court:

- (a) Set an immediate hearing pursuant to Section 119.11(1) of the Florida Statutes;
- (b) Find that the Long-Term Care Facilities COVID-19 Records are public records subject to disclosure under the Public Records Act and Article I, Section 24 of the Florida Constitution, to which no valid exemption applies;
- (c) Find that the Defendants unlawfully refused to permit access to those portions of the Long-Term Care Facilities COVID-19 Records yet to be released, specifically including the records relating to staff and resident deaths by facility, in violation of the Public Records Act and Article I, Section 24 of the Florida Constitution;
- (d) Order the Defendants to immediately provide to the News Media all outstanding records responsive to the News Media's public records requests at issue in this lawsuit;
- (e) Award the News Media their reasonable attorneys' fees, costs, and expenses incurred in this action, as provided in Section 119.12 of the Florida Statutes; and
- (f) Grant the News Media such additional and further relief as this Court deems just and proper.

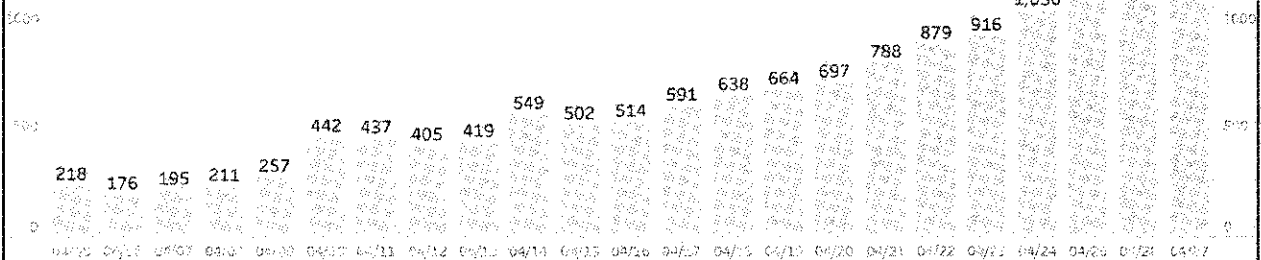

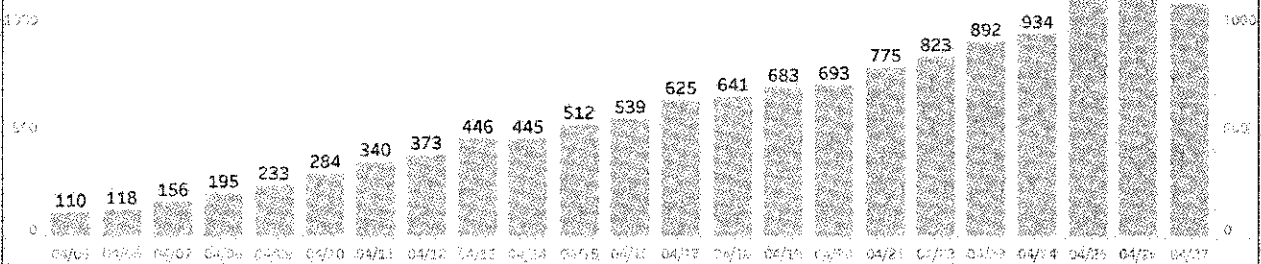

EXECUTIVE ORDER NUMBER 20-51

(Establishes COVID-19 Response Protocol and Directs Public Health Emergency)

WHEREAS, Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) is a severe acute respiratory illness that can spread among humans through respiratory transmission and presents with symptoms similar to those of influenza; and

WHEREAS, in late 2019, a new and significant outbreak of COVID-19 emerged in China; and

WHEREAS, the World Health Organization declared COVID-19 a Public Health Emergency of International Concern; and

WHEREAS, in response to the recent COVID-19 outbreak in China, Iran, Italy and South Korea, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention ("CDC") has deemed it necessary to prohibit or restrict non-essential travel to or from those countries; and

WHEREAS, in response to the recent COVID-19 outbreak in Japan, the CDC has advised older travelers and those with chronic medical conditions to avoid nonessential travel and all travelers to exercise enhanced precautions; and

WHEREAS, the CDC currently recommends community preparedness and everyday prevention measures be taken by all individuals and families in the United States, including voluntary home isolation when individuals are sick with respiratory symptoms, covering coughs and sneezes with a tissue and disposal of the tissue immediately thereafter, washing hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, use of alcohol-based hand sanitizers with 60%-95%

alcohol if soap and water are not readily available and routinely cleaning frequently touched surfaces and objects to increase community resilience and readiness for responding to an outbreak; and

WHEREAS, two individuals in the State of Florida tested presumptively positive for COVID-19, including a resident of Manatee County and a resident of Hillsborough County; and

WHEREAS, the CDC currently recommends mitigation measures in communities with COVID-19 cases, including staying at home when sick, keeping away from others who are sick and staying at home when a household member is sick with respiratory disease symptoms or if instructed to do so by public health officials or a health care provider; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary and appropriate to take action to ensure that COVID-19 remains controlled and that residents and visitors in Florida remain safe and secure;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, RON DESANTIS, as Governor of Florida, by virtue of the authority vested in me by Article IV, Section (1)(a) of the Florida Constitution, and all other applicable laws, promulgate the following Executive Order to take immediate effect:

Section 1. Because of the foregoing conditions, I direct the State Health Officer and Surgeon General, Dr. Scott Rivkees, to declare a public health emergency in the State of Florida, pursuant to his authority in section 381.00315, Florida Statutes. The State Health Officer is authorized and directed to use his judgment as to the duration of this public health emergency.

Section 2. In accordance with section 381.0011(7), Florida Statutes, I direct the State Health Officer to take any action necessary to protect the public health.

Section 3. I direct the State Health Officer to follow the guidelines established by the CDC in establishing protocols to control the spread of COVID-19 and educate the public on prevention.

Section 4. In accordance with section 381.0011(7), Florida Statutes, I designate the Florida Department of Health as the lead state agency to coordinate emergency response activities among the various state agencies and local governments. The State Health Officer, or his designee, shall advise the Executive Office of the Governor on the implementation of these emergency response activities.

Section 5. All actions taken by the State Health Officer with respect to this emergency before the issuance of this Executive Order are ratified.

Section 6. The Florida Department of Health will actively monitor, at a minimum, all persons meeting the definition of a Person Under Investigation (“PUI”) as defined by the CDC for COVID-19 for a period of at least 14 days or until the PUI tests negative for COVID-19. Active monitoring by the Florida Department of Health will include at least the following:

- A. Risk assessment within 24 hours of learning an individual meets the criteria for a PUI.
- B. Twice-daily temperature checks.

Section 7. The Florida Department of Health, pursuant to its authority in section 381.00315, Florida Statutes, will ensure that all individuals meeting the CDC’s definition of a PUI are isolated or quarantined for a period of 14 days or until the person tests negative for COVID-19.

Section 8. I hereby direct the Florida Department of Health to make its own determinations as to quarantine, isolation and other necessary public health interventions as permitted under Florida law.

Section 9. I direct all agencies under the direction of the Governor to fully cooperate with the Florida Department of Health, and any representative thereof in furtherance of this Order.

Agencies not under the direction of the Governor are requested to provide such assistance as is required.

EXECUTIVE ORDER NUMBER 20-52

(Emergency Management - COVID-19 Public Health Emergency)

WHEREAS, Novel Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) is a severe acute respiratory illness that can spread among humans through respiratory transmission and presents with symptoms similar to those of influenza; and

WHEREAS, in late 2019, a new and significant outbreak of COVID-19 emerged in China; and

WHEREAS, the World Health Organization previously declared COVID-19 a Public Health Emergency of International Concern; and

WHEREAS, in response to the recent COVID-19 outbreak in China, Iran, Italy, Japan and South Korea, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention ("CDC") has deemed it necessary to prohibit or restrict non-essential travel to or from those countries; and

WHEREAS, on March 1, 2020, I issued Executive Order number 20-51 directing the Florida Department of Health to issue a Public Health Emergency; and

WHEREAS, on March 1, 2020, the State Surgeon General and State Health Officer declared a Public Health Emergency exists in the State of Florida as a result of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, on March 7, 2020, I directed the Director of the Division of Emergency Management to activate the State Emergency Operations Center to Level 2 to provide coordination and response to the COVID-19 emergency; and

WHEREAS, as of March 9, 2020, eight counties in Florida have positive cases for COVID-19, and COVID-19 poses a risk to the entire state of Florida; and

WHEREAS, the CDC currently recommends community preparedness and everyday prevention measures be taken by all individuals and families in the United States, including voluntary home isolation when individuals are sick with respiratory symptoms, covering coughs and sneezes with a tissue and disposal of the tissue immediately thereafter, washing hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, using of alcohol-based hand sanitizers with 60%-95% alcohol if soap and water are not readily available and routinely cleaning frequently touched surfaces and objects to increase community resilience and readiness for responding to an outbreak; and

WHEREAS, the CDC currently recommends mitigation measures for communities experiencing an outbreak including staying at home when sick, keeping away from others who are sick, limiting face-to-face contact with others as much as possible, consulting with your healthcare provider if individuals or members of a household are at high risk for COVID-19 complications, wearing a facemask if advised to do so by a healthcare provider or by a public health official, staying home when a household member is sick with respiratory disease symptoms if instructed to do so by public health officials or a health care provider; and

WHEREAS, as Governor, I am responsible for meeting the dangers presented to this state and its people by this emergency.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, RON DESANTIS, as Governor of Florida, by virtue of the authority vested in me by Article IV, Section (1)(a) of the Florida Constitution, Chapter 252, Florida Statutes, and all other applicable laws, promulgate the following Executive Order to take immediate effect:

Section 1. Because of the foregoing conditions, I declare a state of emergency exists in the State of Florida.

Section 2. I designate the Director of the Division of Emergency Management (“Director”) as the State Coordinating Officer for the duration of this emergency and direct him to execute the State’s Comprehensive Emergency Management Plan and other response, recovery, and mitigation plans necessary to cope with the emergency. Additionally, I designate the State Health Officer and Surgeon General as a Deputy State Coordinating Officer and State Incident Commander.

Pursuant to section 252.36(1)(a), Florida Statutes, I delegate to the State Coordinating Officer the authority to exercise those powers delineated in sections 252.36(5)-(10), Florida Statutes, which he shall exercise as needed to meet this emergency, subject to the limitations of section 252.33, Florida Statutes. In exercising the powers delegated by this Order, the State Coordinating Officer shall confer with the Governor to the fullest extent practicable. The State Coordinating Officer shall also have the authority to:

A. Seek direct assistance and enter into agreements with any and all agencies of the United States Government as may be needed to meet the emergency.

B. Designate additional Deputy State Coordinating Officers, as necessary.

C. Suspend the effect of any statute, rule, or order that would in any way prevent, hinder, or delay any mitigation, response, or recovery action necessary to cope with this emergency.

D. Enter orders as may be needed to implement any of the foregoing powers; however, the requirements of sections 252.46 and 120.54(4), Florida Statutes, do not apply to any such orders issued by the State Coordinating Officer; however, no such order shall remain in effect beyond the expiration of this Executive Order, to include any extension.

Section 3. I order the Adjutant General to activate the Florida National Guard, as needed, to deal with this emergency.

Section 4. I find that the special duties and responsibilities resting upon some State, regional, and local agencies and other governmental bodies in responding to the emergency may require them to suspend the application of the statutes, rules, ordinances, and orders they administer. Therefore, I issue the following authorizations:

A. Pursuant to section 252.36(1)(a), Florida Statutes, the Executive Office of the Governor may suspend all statutes and rules affecting budgeting to the extent necessary to provide budget authority for state agencies to cope with this emergency. The requirements of sections 252.46 and 120.54(4), Florida Statutes, do not apply to any such suspension issued by the Executive Office of the Governor; however, no such suspension shall remain in effect beyond the expiration of this Executive Order, to include any extension.

B. Each State agency may suspend the provisions of any regulatory statute prescribing the procedures for conduct of state business or the orders or rules of that agency, if strict compliance with the provisions of any such statute, order, or rule would in any way prevent, hinder, or delay necessary action in coping with the emergency. This includes, but is not limited to, the authority to suspend any and all statutes, rules, ordinances, or orders which affect leasing, printing, purchasing, travel, and the condition of employment and the compensation of employees. For the purposes of this Executive Order, "necessary action in coping with the emergency" means any emergency mitigation, response, or recovery action: (1) prescribed in the State Comprehensive Emergency Management Plan ("CEMP"); or (2) ordered by the State Coordinating Officer. The requirements of sections 252.46 and 120.54, Florida Statutes, shall not apply to any such suspension issued by a State agency; however, no such suspension shall remain in effect beyond the expiration of this Executive Order, to include any extensions.

C. In accordance with section 465.0275, Florida Statutes, pharmacists may dispense up to a 30-day emergency prescription refill of maintenance medication to persons who reside in an area or county covered under this Executive Order and to emergency personnel who have been activated by their state and local agency but who do not reside in an area or county covered by this Executive Order.

D. In accordance with section 252.38, Florida Statutes, each political subdivision within the State of Florida may waive the procedures and formalities otherwise required of the political subdivision by law pertaining to:

1) Performance of public work and taking whatever prudent action is necessary to ensure the health, safety, and welfare of the community;

2) Entering into contracts; however, political subdivisions are cautioned against entering into time and materials contracts without ceiling as defined by 2 CFR 200.318(j) or cost plus percentage contracts as defined by 2 CFR 200.323(d);

3) Incurring obligations;

4) Employment of permanent and temporary workers;

5) Utilization of volunteer workers;

6) Rental of equipment;

7) Acquisition and distribution, with or without compensation, of supplies, materials, and facilities; and,

8) Appropriation and expenditure of public funds.

E. All State agencies responsible for the use of State buildings and facilities may close such buildings and facilities in those portions of the State affected by this emergency, to the extent necessary to meet this emergency. I direct each State agency to report the closure of any State

building or facility to the Secretary of the Department of Management Services. Under the authority contained in section 252.36, Florida Statutes, I direct each County to report the closure of any building or facility operated or maintained by the County or any political subdivision therein to the Secretary of the Department of Management Services. Furthermore, I direct the Secretary of the Department of Management Services to:

- 1) Maintain an accurate and up-to-date list of all such closures; and,
- 2) Provide that list daily to the State Coordinating Officer.

Section 5. I find that the demands placed upon the funds appropriated to the agencies of the State of Florida and to local agencies are unreasonably great and the funds currently available may be inadequate to pay the costs of coping with this emergency. In accordance with section 252.37(2), Florida Statutes, I direct that sufficient funds be made available, as needed, by transferring and expending moneys appropriated for other purposes, moneys from unappropriated surplus funds, or from the Budget Stabilization Fund.


Section 6. All State agencies entering emergency final orders or other final actions in response to this emergency shall advise the State Coordinating Officer contemporaneously or as soon as practicable.

Section 7. Medical professionals and workers, social workers, and counselors with good and valid professional licenses issued by states other than the State of Florida may render such services in Florida during this emergency for persons affected by this emergency with the condition that such services be rendered to such persons free of charge, and with the further condition that such services be rendered under the auspices of the American Red Cross or the Florida Department of Health.

Section 8. All activities taken by the Director of the Division of Emergency Management and the State Health Officer and Surgeon General with respect to this emergency before the issuance of this Executive Order are ratified. This Executive Order shall expire sixty days from this date unless extended.

EMERGENCY ORDER

WHEREAS, the Governor of the State of Florida issued Executive Order No. 20-52 in response to the COVID-19 Public Health Emergency which poses a severe threat to the entire State of Florida and requires that timely precautions are taken to protect the communities, critical infrastructure, and general welfare of this State; and,

WHEREAS, the Governor has designated the Director of the Division of Emergency Management as the State Coordinating Officer for the duration of this emergency and has delegated to the State Coordinating Officer the authority to exercise those powers delineated in sections 252.36(5)-(10), Florida Statutes; and,

NOW THEREFORE, I hereby find that the Division of Emergency Management's timely performance of disaster response functions related to COVID-19 Public Health Emergency is hindered by the application of procedures imposed by statute, rule, and/or order.

Therefore, pursuant to Section 2 of Executive Order No. 20-52, I hereby issue the following authorization(s):

I. Suspend sections 393.13(4), 400.022(1)(b), 429.28(1)(d), 429.85(1)(d) Florida Statutes, for the particular purpose of prohibiting certain individuals from visiting facilities. For purposes of this order, a facility includes nursing homes, assisted living

facilities, adult family-care homes, long-term care facilities, and adult group homes. The order applies as follows:


- a. Any person infected with COVID-19 who has not had two consecutive negative test results separated by 24 hours is prohibited from visiting a facility; or
- b. Any person showing or presenting signs or symptoms of a respiratory infection, including cough, fever, shortness of breath or sore throat is prohibited from visiting a facility; or
- c. Any person who has or may have been in close contact with a person(s) infected with COVID-19 who has not tested negative for COVID-19 is prohibited from visiting a facility until 14 days after their interaction with the person(s) who is infected with COVID-19; or
- d. Any person who traveled internationally is prohibited from visiting a facility until 14 days after their return to the United States; or
- e. Any person who traveled on a cruise ship is prohibited from visiting a facility until 14 days after their return to the United States; or
- f. Any person who has been in a community with confirmed community spread of COVID-19, as identified by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention or a state public health agency, is prohibited from visiting a facility within 14 days of their presence in the community with community spread; or
- g. Any person who resides in a community with confirmed community spread of COVID-19, as identified by the Centers for Disease Control and

Prevention or a state public health agency, is prohibited from visiting a facility.

Because section 252.36(5)(a), Florida Statutes, allows the Governor to suspend the provisions of "any regulatory statute prescribing the procedures for [the] conduct of state business", and because Executive Order No. 20-52 designates the Director of the Division of Emergency Management as the State Coordinating Officer for this emergency, the requirements of sections 252.46 and 120.54(4), Florida Statutes, do not apply to this Order.



EMERGENCY ORDER

WHEREAS, the Governor of the State of Florida issued Executive Order No. 20-52 in response to the COVID-19 Public Health Emergency, which poses a severe threat to the entire State of Florida and requires that timely precautions are taken to protect the communities, critical infrastructure, and general welfare of this State; and,

WHEREAS, the Governor has designated the Director of the Division of Emergency Management as the State Coordinating Officer for the duration of this emergency and has delegated to the State Coordinating Officer the authority to exercise those powers delineated in sections 252.36(5)-(10), Florida Statutes; and,

WHEREAS, on March 14, 2020, Governor DeSantis directed me, as the State Coordinating Officer, under the powers afforded by Executive Order No. 20-52, to prohibit visitation to certain facilities for thirty days from the date of this order in the State of Florida.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, JARED MOSKOWITZ hereby find that the Division of Emergency Management's timely performance of disaster response functions related to COVID-19 Public Health Emergency is hindered by the application of procedures imposed by statute, rule, and/or order. Therefore, pursuant to Section 2 of Executive Order No. 20-52, I hereby suspend sections 393.13(4), 394.459(5)(c), 400.022(1)(b), 429.28(1)(d),

429.85(1)(d), and 916.107(5) Florida Statutes, for the particular purpose of prohibiting all individuals from visiting facilities within the State of Florida. For purposes of this order, a facility includes: Group Home Facilities under chapter 393, Florida Statutes; Developmental Disabilities Centers under chapter 393; Nursing Homes as provided under chapter 400; homes for Special Services as provided under chapter 400; Long-Term Care Hospitals, as provided under chapter 395, part I; Transitional Living Facilities, as provided under chapter 400; Intermediate Care Facilities for the Developmentally Disabled, as provided under chapter 400; Assisted Living Facilities, as provided under chapter 429; Adult Mental Health and Treatment Facilities under chapter 394; Adult Forensic Facilities under chapter 916; Civil Facilities under chapter 916; and Adult Family-Care Homes, as provided under chapter 429, Florida Statutes. The order applies as follows:

1. Every facility must prohibit the entry of any individual, to the facility except in the following circumstances:
 - a. Family members, friends, and visiting residents in end-of-life situations;
 - b. Hospice or palliative care workers caring for residents in end-of-life situations;
 - c. Any individuals providing necessary health care to a resident;
 - d. Facility staff;
 - e. Facility residents;
 - f. Attorneys of Record for a resident in an Adult Mental Health and Treatment Facility for court related matters if virtual or telephonic means are unavailable; or
 - g. Representatives of the federal or state government seeking entry as part of their official duties, including, but not limited to, Long-Term Care Ombudsman program, representatives of the Department of Children and Families, the Department of Health, the Department of Elderly Affairs, the Agency for Health Care Administration, the Agency for Persons with

Disabilities, a protection and advocacy organization under 42 U.S.C. §15041, the Office of the Attorney General, any law enforcement officer, and any emergency medical personnel.


2. Individuals seeking entry to the facility under the above section 1 will not be allowed to enter if they meet any of the screening criteria listed below:
 - a. Any person infected with COVID-19 who has not had two consecutive negative test results separated by 24 hours;
 - b. Any person showing, presenting signs or symptoms of, or disclosing the presence of a respiratory infection, including cough, fever, shortness of breath or sore throat;
 - c. Any person who has been in contact with any person(s) known to be infected with COVID-19, who has not yet tested negative for COVID-19 within the past 14 days;
 - d. Any person who traveled through any airport within the past 14 days; or
 - e. Any person who traveled on a cruise ship within the past 14 days.
4. Residents must be discouraged from leaving the facility.
5. The following documentation must be kept for visitation within a facility:
 - a. Individuals entering a facility subject to the screening criteria above may be screened using a standardized questionnaire or other form of documentation.
 - b. The facility is required to maintain documentation of all non-resident individuals entering the facility. Documentation must include:
 1. Name of the individual;
 2. Date and time of entry; and
 3. The documentation used by the facility to screen the individual showing the individual did not meet any of the enumerated screening criteria, including the screening employee's printed name and signature.

Because section 252.36(5)(a), Florida Statutes, allows the Governor to suspend the provisions of "any regulatory statute prescribing the procedures for [the] conduct of state

business”, and because Executive Order No. 20-52 designates the Director of the Division of Emergency Management as the State Coordinating Officer for this emergency, the requirements of sections 252.46 and 120.54(4), Florida Statutes, do not apply to this Order.


