## MEMORANDUM OF POINTS AND AUTHORITIES

On June 16, 2023, federal agents arrested Mr. Hatch inside the San Diego Superior Court. (ECF 1). On June 15, 2023, Mr. Hatch made his initial appearance in federal court. (ECF 5). Over Mr. Hatch's objection, the United States moved to continue the detention hearing to June 20, 2023, after the three-day weekend. (Id.). On June 20, the Magistrate Court set bond. The government made an oral motion to stay the Magistrate Judge's ruling pending appeal to the District Court. That motion was denied. (ECF 12-13). The government thereafter filed a written motion to stay the Magistrate Judge's ruling. (ECF 14). Its motion was again denied. (ECF 16). The government appealed the Magistrate Judge's release order to the District Court. (ECF 22). On June 22, 2023, the District Court ordered Mr. Hatch's release on bond. As a condition of release, the Court ordered Mr. Hatch not to communicate with any witnesses in his case. Although Mr. Hatch's fiancé, Rajel Nelson, was not present in California during his arrest for being a felon in possession of a firearm, the government notified the Court that it believed she may be a witness and did not want Mr. Hatch to communicate with her, even though they lived together at the time and were engaged to be married. Mr. Hatch objected.

Over six months have elapsed since Mr. Hatch was released, and he is still not permitted to communicate with his fiancé. He respectfully requests that the Court modify the conditions of his release so he may communicate with her. Counsel has conferred with counsel for Ms. Nelson. They concur with this request.
