
On consideration of the briefs filed by the parties and *amicus curiae*<sup>1</sup> and the oral arguments held on 6/29/2026,

### IT IS ORDERED:

The 6/26/2026 order of the superior court directing the Division to include appellee Sullivan as a candidate for United States Senator on the primary election ballot is AFFIRMED. This matter is remanded for the Division of Elections to determine, in the first instance, how appellee Sullivan shall be listed as a candidate within the confines of existing Alaska ballot design law. A full opinion will be issued at a later date.
